*Scripture Reading: Psalm 105:5*

*Text for Today: Remember the wonderful works that he had done, his miracles, and the judgments...*

I can't get it out of my mind...I will never forget that moment. It was Christmas Eve Service 2003. Communion was being offered to all, either by going forward or by waiting in your pew.

And then I saw him: a very weak and wobbly young man, walking with determination toward the altar. He could have waited in his pew, but no – his walk told it all! “Here am I Lord, send me.”
